Created more than six hundred years ago, Tashlich is the act of going to a place with naturally flowing water, such as a creek or river, on the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah and symbolically casting off our sins by tossing bread crumbs or pebbles into the water.

Please join us on the afternoon of **September 19** as, together as a M'kor Shalom family, we cast our sins into the river. We are tentatively scheduled to meet at Lions Lake in Voorhees at 3:00 pm. Check the M'kor Shalom website for the most up-to-date information.

Tashlich is a great way to experience *teshuvah* (repentance) as forgiveness in a tangible way. The short service will be led by our clergy.

- Attendance will be limited.
- Masks are required for those 2 years of age and older.
- Chairs and/or blankets required for social distancing.

- No food, drink or facility use.
- Please bring the birdseed that was distributed in your High Holy Day Gift Bags.

Open to M'kor Shalom congregants and their families; pre-registration is required.
